**WHEREAS**, the City of Clifton is permitted to join national cooperative purchasing agreements under the authority of N.J.S.A. 52:34-6.2(b)(3); and,

**WHEREAS**, the City of Clifton is a member of the Omnia Partners (formerly U.S. Communities), a national cooperative, since January 1, 2012 thru present, in accordance with N.J.S.A. 52:34-6.2, and LFN 2012-10, which allows local contracting units to utilize national cooperative contracts as a method of procurement; and,



**WHEREAS**, pursuant to Resolution 213-21 of May 4, 2021, an advertisement was initially placed in the Herald News on May 7, 2021, to announce the City's interest in utilizing the OMNIA Partners national cooperative contract for purchasing of solar powered flashing traffic signs, with comment period ending May 18, 2021; and,

**WHEREAS**, Omnia Partners (formerly U.S. Communities) awarded the above referenced contract (#2020-200), to TAPCO (Traffic and Parking Control Co., Inc.), 5100 W. Brown Deer Road, Brown Deer, WI 53223, which provides for Traffic Control Products and Related Products and Solutions; and,

**WHEREAS**, the City Engineer and the Purchasing Agent concur that the City will be able to increase visibility of road safety signage, consequently improving traffic safety conditions; and,

**WHEREAS**, the TAPCO term of contract with OMNIA Partners, under contract number #2020-200, for Traffic Control Products and Related Products and Solutions, is from March 1, 2020 through to February 28, 2025; and,

**WHEREAS**, the Purchasing Agent is satisfied with the procurement process conducted by OMNIA Partners, and the contract which was awarded to TAPCO and along with associated documentation submitted by both OMNIA Partners and TAPCO, the Purchasing Agent finds all in compliance with the guidance in LFN 2012-10; and,

**WHEREAS**, the Purchasing Agent followed all applicable guidelines stipulated by the Department of Community Affairs, Division of Local Government Services as outlined in Local Finance Notice 2012-10; and,

**WHEREAS**, there were no alternative approaches and/or rejections made by any New Jersey contractors/vendors prior to or since the aforementioned comment deadline; and,

**WHEREAS**, it is the intent of the City of Clifton to make a contract award to TAPCO (Traffic and Parking Control Co., Inc.), 5100 W. Brown Deer Road, Brown Deer, WI 53223, for solar powered flashing traffic signs in accordance with the rate schedule under Contract #2020-200 in a not to exceed amount of \$100,000, pursuant to the Barron County Highway, Wisconsin Request for Proposals for Traffic Control Products and Related Products and Solutions (contract 2020-200), for the period of March 1, 2020 through to February 28, 2025; and,
